



GLOSSARY OF TERMS USED IN THIS TREE ID KEY

Needle-shaped: *More or less, sharp and pointy.*


Needles, single: *Individual attachment to twig.*



Needles, cluster: *A dense group of a dozen or more needles.*




Needles, bundle: *A group of 2 -5 needles "bundled" together at their bases.*




Needles, flat: *Much wider than thick. Tends not to roll easily between fingers.*

Needles, square or round: *About as wide as thick. Rolls easily between fingers.*

Branching, Alternate: *Paired side branches do not occur opposite each other from a main twig. Also true for buds and leaf stem "scars."*




Branching, opposite: *Paired side branches occur on opposite sides of a main twig. Also true for buds and leaf stem "scars."*



Leaves, simple: *Your basic leaf with one stem and contiguous leaf surface.*




Leaves, compound: *One stem, multiple leaf surfaces (looks like separate leaves).*



Leaves lobed: *Finger-like projections of leaf, like oaks.*

Chambered pith: *Cores of twigs are divided into small chambers.*
